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### Attainment of Disadvantage Pupils

The school is working hard to improve the outcomes for disadvantage pupils and is targeting its Pupil Premium Funding to that end. Last year disadvantaged pupils across school made at least good progress and in many year groups outstanding progress. Progress in mathematics was weaker than in reading and writing, and this has now improved due to targeted investment in training staff to improve their teaching in mathematics.

**PE and Sports Premium Allocation £9475 is used to subsidise the salary of the sport coach in school full time during term time and to run additional activities in the holidays.**
