



Uniform Policy

The Governing Body of Rendell Primary School believe that it is important for all children to have a shared sense of identity and pride in themselves and their school and believes the wearing of a collective school uniform is an important part of having the right attitude to school.

School uniform can be purchased from:

- Schoolwear 5, Swan Street, Loughborough offer a full range of school clothing.
- Rosebuddies Situated on Loughborough Market
- General clothing without the school logo is available from a range of stores.

Our school uniform consists of the following:

Winter: Grey/black trousers/skirts (**no jeans**)
White polo shirts with logo
Red sweatshirt or cardigan with logo.
Sensible shoes (not trainers) – no heels, flip-flops or open toe sandals.

Summer: As above but with the option of:
Grey/black shorts.
Dresses – red and white checks or stripes.
Sensible shoes (not trainers) – no heels, flip-flops or open toe sandals.

P.E. **(Indoor)**
Black shorts
White T-shirt with logo
Plimsolls
(Outdoor)
Black hooded top
Black jogging bottoms
Trainers for outdoor PE only

Also available are fleece jackets, mistral jackets (reversible), hats, book bags, school bags and P.E. bags. These are available from the School Wear Centre in Loughborough and Rosebuddies (Loughborough Market).

Foot-wear

It is necessary for health and safety reasons for all children to wear sensible shoes (not trainers) in order to use the equipment on the Recky at playtimes and lunchtimes. Please ask if you are unsure about appropriate footwear.



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Marked Clothing

All possessions, especially clothes, **should be clearly marked** with your child's name. This is vital if "lost" items are to be returned to their owners. It is also very useful if coats have loops so they can be hung up in the cloakrooms. Lost property is placed in a tub in school – please ask at the office.

Do not allow your child to bring toys or valuables to school. While every effort is made, the school cannot be responsible for loss or damage to clothes or property. Your child will be requested not to wear jewellery during lessons that involve movement, as it can be dangerous. There is a jewellery policy which has been agreed by all the primary schools in Loughborough. A copy is available from outside the school office. If it is necessary for your child to bring money or valuables to school they should be given to the teacher for safekeeping.
