

## WOW DAY!

Children to go on a magic bean hunt! They will plant our beans ready for our story.

## Experience

## Did the beanstalk grow further than the Giants castle?

We will read the story of Jack and the Beanstalk and explore good and bad characters. We will look at different Traditional Tales such as 'The three little pigs' and discuss what other houses Jack might have seen on the way. What materials are they made of? Can we write our own ending to the story? In Maths we will learn how much is double and half of the Giant's treasure.

## Team work

## How many leaves Beanstalk?

We will learn to estimate, explore different ways of counting and adding numbers. We will make our own number beanstalk. We will look at how to measure the beanstalks and put them in order of height. We will also study paintings of Vincent Van Gogh and the flowers he painted. We will paint our own sunflowers and learn to mix colours to achieve desired effect. How do different colours make us feel?

## Does a bean need water?

Children will learn the names of plants and what they need to grow. They will carry out an experiment to find out if seeds need light to grow. We will plant our own beans and learn days of the week to keep a diary of what happens.
